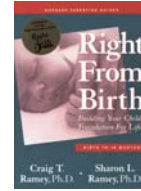


RIGHT FROM BIRTH & GOING TO SCHOOL PARENT TRAINING

Program Overview



PURPOSE

Provide parents and other primary caregivers with scientific evidence-based knowledge and skills that positively impact children's optimal social, emotional and cognitive development

POPULATION TO BE SERVED

Disadvantaged parents of children ages 0 – 3 for *Right from Birth* and disadvantaged parents of children ages 3 – 8 for *Going to School*

PROCESS

Training of trainers:

- Recruit, interview and select parent trainers
- Conduct training of parent trainers, including content knowledge, facilitation skills, parent engagement tactics, and data collection
- Prepare parent training materials customized to meet unique needs of each program venue

Training of parents:

- Preliminary planning, including financial and human resources
- Site selection
- Session logistics, including childcare, security, refreshments and activities
- Parent recruitment
- Trainer support (mentoring, coaching, troubleshooting)
- Data collection
- Documentation systems and management

PAYOFF

- Parents gain knowledge and skills to promote their children's social, emotional and intellectual growth
- Their children enter school better prepared socially, emotionally and academically
- Parent involvement in their children's education increases
- Student achievement increases
- Gap between high and low achievers closes
- A sense of community and support is formed among parents
